


8 Weeks








6 Weeks BEFORE YOU MOVE

Collect free boxes from restaurants, liquor, grocery, oce supply stores, or local bookstores.

Mark moving boxes that are fragile.

4 Weeks BEFORE YOUMOVE

Use food in your home.
Start meal planning around food in your pantry and the frozen food in your refrigerator so you don't have to move it to your new home and save on your grocery bill these last few weeks.
Add to your organizational folder.
Gather all financial, legal and medical (include dental and optical) records in one place. Include birth certificates and passports. Make sure your moving company and moving contract is in this file for easy access
Contact your insurance provider.
Make sure they know the last date you will need insurance on your existing property. This is a great time to shop your insurance provider with others for better rates.

Contact Cable and Internet providers who serve your new address, order service and schedule your installation appointment.
Moving to an entirely new area?
Research your new Doctors and Vets in your new area. Update your voter registration. Need a hotel for your trip or destination? Book your itinerary and hotel accommodations. Change prescriptions to new pharmacy

Pets will often be confused and uneasy about being moved from their familiar settings. Make sure your pets collars all have

	Take a video of all your belongings in your home.
	This could be helpful if needing to validate what your belongings looked like should you have some sort of claim. This is a good thing to do regardless of moving. It itemizes your personal belongings should you have any insurance claim.
	Line up cleaner and any repair services for your home that may be wanted/needed.

Pick up things that are being moved from the outside. Clean patio furniture before it's moved. Put away hoses and lawn decorative items that are going



Moving Items. Make sure you have enough boxes. Packing tape. Markers to write on boxes. Have different color marker for different areas of home. Stickers to put on boxes to identify what room they will go into when delivered. Material to protect the floors and carpeting in your old and new home.
Deliveries. Make sure you canceled and/or redirected scheduled deliveries
Drivers License. Update your drivers license. Move this one to closer to moving date or after moving date.
Moving a Freezer or Refrigerator? Disconnect any freezer or refrigerator a day in advance to it can defrost.
Pack an essentials box with everything you'll need for your first 24 hours in your new home. Include a roll or two of toilet paper.
