You Have Options

If you're facing missed payments, foreclosure notices, or financial hardship, there may be solutions available to you. The sooner you act, the more choices you may have.

COMMON FORECLOSURE ALTERNATIVES

- **Loan Modification** Work with your lender to adjust terms, rates, or payment schedule.
- **Forbearance** Temporary pause or reduction in payments to allow you to catch up.
- Repayment Plan Add missed payments to future payments in manageable installments.
- Sell Your Home Traditional Listing to maximize sale price on the open market, or Cash Sale for quick closing without repairs or showings.
- **Short Sale** Lender accepts less than the amount owed to prevent foreclosure.
- **Deed in Lieu of Foreclosure** Voluntarily transfer the property to the lender to satisfy the debt.


